# Karen Baker Addresses the BACVC

The Bay Area Corporate Volunteer Council was excited to welcome Karen Baker, California State Secretary of Service and Volunteering, as guest speaker at the March BACVC General Meeting, hosted by Synopsys, Inc. Secretary Baker addressed the BACVC on timely matters facing the volunteer community in this economic

Theodore Radamaker is a new TVP volunteer who truly exemplifies what our work at The Volunteer Center is all about. From the moment he stepped foot in The Volunteer Center's door, his dedication and commitment to working with animals in need radiated throughout the office.



Theodore went to incredible

lengths to secure a volunteer position with the Marine Mammal Center at Fort Kronkhite in Sausalito. Despite public transportation only providing service to the headlands one day a week, he went above and beyond to make it to this remote location, attended their orientation and began volunteering. Just one day after the orientation he was knee deep in Marine Mammal rescue, helping to rehabilitate injured marine mammals and making a huge difference in the lives of these distressed creatures. Theodore's work and dedication is an inspiration and a highlight of the true essence of volunteerism.
