To make sure the holidays are as festive as can be, Compass Community Services wants to make sure that every gift is wrapped and individually labeled. This will make sure that each and every child that receives a gift feels special. Lisa Dyas, the Volunteer Coordinator for Compass Community Services said, "We had a three high school groups help us out last year, and they had a great time!" Lisa said that Compass Community Services utilizes youth volunteers all year, but their biggest need for youth volunteers comes during the holidays! "The Gift Wrapping Party is great for high-school youth," she said, "It's a great way to have a hands-on opportunity to see what gifts are going to the families. It gives youth an opportunity to volunteer where they don't have to be super-serious, and it's loads of fun watching all the gifts pile up!"

Save San Francisquito Creek

Save The Bay needs your help to empty their native plant nursery this holiday season! Youth volunteers will learn about habitat restoration as you plant species like blue-eyed grass, white yarrow, and sea lavender.



This unique wetland habitat provides a home to many native species, including shorebirds, waterfowl, and anadromous fish such as Steelhead trout. With the help of volunteers Save The Bay grows native seedlings in an on-site Native Plant Nursery, remove invasive plants and will plant 8,000 native seedlings along the shoreline this year. Save The Bay partners with the City of Palo Alto Baylands Nature Preserve to restore wetlands at the mouth of San Francisquito Creek where it meets the Bay.

Distribute Food to the Hungry this Holiday!

Second Harvest Food Bank serves rallies community resources to assist people who are hungry in Santa Clara and San Mateo counties, and they need your help!

The holidays are an especially busy time at Second Harvest Food Bank of Santa Clara and San Mateo Counties, which collects and distributes more than 30 million pounds of food each year to low-income children, adults and seniors. The Food Bank currently serves an average of 163,000 individuals each month; nearly 60% are families with dependent children. This is enough people to fill AT&T Park more than three times.
